

# Cooper Summer Camp Packing List

***IMPORTANT: Label each item with your camper's name.***

## What to bring daily:

- Backpack
- Reusable water bottle
- Snacks
- Lunch (if not registered for lunch add-on)
- 2 swimsuits\* (one-piece for girls)
- Change of athletic clothes (including undergarments)
- Pool towel
- Sunscreen
- Bug spray
- Goggles (optional)
- Medically-necessary medications (for example, inhaler, EpiPen; we are not authorized to administer any non-necessary medications)
- A.M./P.M. Extended Care only: extra snack for breakfast/afternoon snack (optional)

## What NOT to bring:

- Electronics – All electronics/phones/smartwatches must be left at home. If one is brought, it must remain in the camper's cubby until the end of the day.
- Nuts – We are a nut-free environment, so when packing snacks/lunch, please do not include foods with nuts.

### 1. What should my camper be wearing when arriving at camp?

We incorporate water-based activities throughout the day. Your camper should arrive wearing their swimsuit with sunscreen and bug spray applied. We suggest wearing athletic clothes over their swimsuits and athletic shoes so they can change back into them when the water activities end.

*See below for which days your child will have morning water time:*

- Kids Camp (ages 5-7): Monday/Wednesday/Special Event Friday
- Youth Camp (ages 8-12): Tuesday/Thursday/Special Event Friday

### 2. Why does my camper need two swimsuits?\*

Because our Kids Splash Campers and Youth Campers have two opportunities for water-focused fun throughout the day, we request your camper pack an extra swimsuit in addition to the one they wear in the morning. Though this is not required, it will ensure your child can change into a dry swimsuit for their afternoon pooltime. If you prefer not to pack a second swimsuit, they will wear the same swimsuit they wore in the morning.

### 3. Should my camper pack toys or activities to keep themselves busy?

At camp we aim to provide an engaging environment where your child can try a lot of activities. They won't be short on things to do, that's for sure! Therefore, we request your camper not bring any toys of their own to prevent them from being a distraction or getting lost or broken.
